The DSG not only organises exhibitions, but also offers schools and individuals the opportunity to learn stone carving in courses. In Mutare, in the east of the country, two committed German women have launched the „Mutare Tales“ event. Artists from different genres receive advice and support here.

In addition to promoting cultural activities, DSG also supports organisations and educational institutions.

Zimbabwe Workcamp Association (ZWA)

The ZWA, which has been an important partner of DSG since 1995, has set itself the goal



of enabling young people to carry out charitable work for villages and organisations in an accompanied context.

For example, they can carry out projects with and for small farmers to improve the groundwater situation.

Under supervision, they learn to remove invasive plants or help to preserve important historical sites such as the Khami Ruins. It is important that German and Zimbabwean young people work together and gain intercultural experience for their lives.

This is why DSG finances the local participation fees for young Zimbabweans. Whenever possible, young Zimbabweans are also invited to Germany for meetings.
